CHAMPS is a volunteer 501(c)(3) organization whose purpose is to promote youth conservation, education, and marksmanship programs and to teach safe methods in sportsmen activities. CHAMPS encourages the growth and development of exceptional marksmanship programs that complement and expand the opportunities of the competitors within those programs.

All directors at the club are volunteers and dedicate many hours every week, year round, so youth ages 8 through 15 can achieve success. In addition to gun safety and the proper methods in competition shooting, your shooter will learn focus and confidence. Many children who feel they "do not fit" when it comes to other types of sports tend to find success here. Some of our past shooters have found confidence and have gone on to be successful elsewhere, including the sports where they thought they did not fit. Our team starts with the basics needed to be successful. There are several shooters at the Olympic level who started their love of shooting through a BB Gun program. Some of our former shooters have attended college on shooting scholarships, some are striving for the Olympics, and others, who have joined the military, have proven themselves beyond successful, especially in shooting qualification. Success can be achieved and we will provide the tools necessary!

Each year, our shooters range from those who would like to attend Nationals to those who want to attend practices but not compete. What does your shooter want to achieve this year? On the next page, we've written the level from registration. We would like you to also write your shooter's level half way through safety class and again prior to the state match. We know his/her goals may change and we want to know this.

PRACTICE / TRAINING

In some sports, you "go to practice." You may hear us use "training" instead. Why?? Training to be a successful competitor is what the shooters are doing.

We have 4 training levels:

- **Level 1:** Dedicated to practice hard, be competitive, and travel to Nationals (if the team qualifies and attends)
- **Level 2:** Want to be dedicated and competitive, but just compete locally (not travel to Nationals)
- **Level 3:** Not sure about the competition side of the program; will decide in December
- **Level 4:** Not interested in (or too young for) the competition side; registering for the less competitive side of the team

Some shooters change their minds as to which level they feel best fits them. That's OKAY! We request that you ask **your shooter** what level **they** feel is their category on:

SAFETY

A safe environment is essential to providing a high quality program. Please report any and all injuries or accidents to the coaches regardless of the nature of the incident. An accident report form may need to be filed with Harrisburg Hunters and Anglers. While HHA maintains a general liability policy, it is recommended that all participants be covered under a personal medical/accident insurance policy.

Knowing your shooter's training level and goals assists us in the tools we provide for your shooter to succeed at the level where he or she wants to be.

Those who decide Nationals is their goal, are not only committing to attending all trainings at the club, but they are also committing to online testing; exercises (homework) given by the directors; and shooting at home.

There are required diet limitations which vary depending on the Training level your shooter chooses. No shooter should have sugar or soda within 48 hours prior to the start of any practice/training or competition. Level 1 shooters should restrict all sugar and soda intake every day since you will be practicing every day, in some capacity.

The directors do understand that there are some shooters with medical conditions requiring a certain amount of sugar daily. It is requested those shooters limit their intake only to what is prescribed by the doctor, not overdoing it.

EYE SIGHT

During the season, you may be asked questions about your shooter's vision. **Please do not be offended.** Due to past experience, what we are asking may be a valid question. There have been times where no one (not even the shooter) had a clue glasses were needed. It was only discovered when shooter tried to focus on the little black dot at the end of the range.

SCHEDULE

Our pre-season safety class is held every Wednesday and Friday until the end of November (except the week of Thanksgiving, then every Wednesday through December 30th). Our regular season practices are every Wednesday and Friday between January 2nd and the end of April. There are 5-7 competitions each year. 3 are within 2 hours of the club, up to 3 are in house, and 1 is the state match. If we finish in the top three at the state match, we are invited to attend the National Match in Rogers, Arkansas. (*An invitation does not necessarily mean we will attend Nationals.*)

During regular-season practices, shooters spend one-half of each practice on the range and one-half in the classroom. Since some of the classes will be packed full of learning leaving no time to take a test, testing for the day will be done online, at home. Doing this allows us to stay on track, making sure all shooters are familiar with the NRA Rule Book prior to the State Match.

The worksheets in class are in the "Team Only" section of the website. All worksheets should be completed using the lesson sheets from Safety Class and the NRA Rulebook. At the National Match, the test is based on the shooter's knowledge rather than verbatim from the book. For that reason, we **teach** the material, rather than have the shooters memorize it.

If your shooter has to miss a class, please follow the steps in the Weather section of this handbook. If you need assistance with understanding the steps, please ask a director for assistance.

STAFF CERTIFICATION

The directors are NRA Instructors, Range Safety Officers, and NRA

Certified Coaches, who also have their clearances.

COMMUNICATION

TEAMAPP (APP AND WEB)

TeamApp is a mobile app you can download from iTunes or Google Play. Once you download TeamApp, you need to create an account with them, verify your email, then search for our team, (**Harrisburg BB Gun Team**). When you request access to our portion of the app, tell us the name of your shooter. This lets us know it is a legitimate request and we will grant access.

Our app has links to our sites, along with safety class documents and various pieces of information, making it readily available on your phone or tablet. Some sections are available to the public, others only to members. Think of it as a one-stop location for bookmarks. If you wish to have us add additional bookmarks or documents, let Pam know and she will add it for you. No smartphone? You can do all the above from a computer at:

Access through the app or a website is one of our reasons for choosing TeamApp over other programs.

ONLINE CALENDAR

Our online calendar is through TeamApp. The schedule will show you practice dates/times, competition possibilities, definite competition dates/times (when available), team events, and more. You can subscribe to the calendar to sync it with your personal calendar.

E-MAIL

Our emails will be sent through TeamApp. They will be stored in our app for the season. Depending on your settings, the app could notify you of the email or send you a copy of the email. When we send an email, we will also send a Remind. If you don't have notifications activated, you will know to check the app/website for the email. If you have any questions or need help creating your account in TeamApp, see Pam.

REMIND

What is this? Why is it this used?

Remind allows us to send a text message to everyone at once. The message arrives to you in the form of a text or alert from the Remind app on your smartphone. Remind allows you to send a reply to the person who sent the message just like regular texting or email..

How do I know who sent the message?


Messages will have initials included (RS=Rusty, CW=Chet, PS=Pam, KW=Tina).

AVAILABILITY

In the phone app, click the availability button, then the plus in upper right corner. On the website, click the availability link, then the "Add Availability Status" button. There are a few fields on this screen:



Member: You, your shooter, or last name x#, if entering for all of you. (ie: Werner x2 means Chet and Tina)




Availability/Available?: Click available or not available. (In app, touch arrow on right to change selection.)




From/To: This would be the same date for a single night or you can set a range. A range, for example, might be that

WEBSITES

WEATHER

The safety of all participants in our program is the primary concern in cases of inclement weather. With the coaches having 4-wheel drive vehicles, they will do everything they can to be at the club.

If you are able to get to the club, there will be a modified practice. This practice will consist of shooting and review games. The test for that class will be online for **everyone**.

If the coaches feel travel would be detrimental, a modified practice will be moved to where you are! (The following also applies if there is practice at the club and you are unable to attend, no matter the reason.) **Practice is never cancelled!** Practice away from the club should follow these steps:

1. Shooters get into and hold each position for at least 10 minutes while holding a can of soup or equivalent weight. By being in and holding each position, you are training your muscles. When

you are sick, your muscle memory will kick in and you will still shoot a good match.

2. Shooters should practice their mental checklist several times while in each position.
3. Shooters must take the required online test. At the end of the test, the shooters will look for the answers that were a guess or not correct in their binder to see what the correct answers should be. If there are any questions, they should make a note of them and talk to Pam. She will be available during cancelled practices via the chat on the website or phone.

The above should take up to an hour rather than the normal 2 hours during in-house practice. If there is a snow storm, there is still time to go outside and have fun. (**Please do not break anything!**) If your gun is at home, you may shoot targets AFTER you complete the above steps.

UNIFORMS AND GEAR

We have no formal uniform, but provide shooter shirts for **all** team events. Shooters wear **matching** sneakers which are below the ankle and comfortable long pants. Many shooters wear pajama pants. Cotton is good; compression or slick material are not.

Shooters use Daisy's Avanti Champion, gun case, ammunition, targets, and other equipment provided by the club.

Families provide **eye protection** for the shooter and themselves, **binoculars** (10x50, capable of focusing at 5 meters), and a **bucket** with optional swivel seat (to store the above items).

Guns may be purchased in the 2nd year. (**First year shooters use a club gun.**) There are a minimum of 6 gunsmithing hours put into prepping a gun before its first use.

VARIOUS INFORMATION

MEDIA RELEASE

Photographs are taken of our shooters and their families during various events and activities. These photographs are used to promote Harrisburg Hunters' and Anglers' Associations' youth programs. Many of these photographs are made available for free download to our families. If you prefer that you or your child not be photographed, notify us in writing at hbgbteam@gmail.com.

INDIVIDUAL & TEAM PHOTOS

Through one of our former shooters, CHAMPs will schedule team and individual photos for all youth teams covered under their umbrella. Photos of your shooter(s) will be available as a free download with a copyright release to have those pictures printed anywhere you would like. (Not all printers require the release, but it is offered in case you need it.)

If you choose to have your photos professionally printed, the use of the photographer's printer is available at his cost. A special digital print with a team and individual photo will be available for each shooter to purchase.

We are proud of this shooter and his enlistment in the Navy, and are very grateful he is "giving back" to the club.

ALCOHOLIC BEVERAGES

Alcoholic beverages are not permitted at the club or during any youth event associated with the club. No one involved with the youth should be under the influence (*any*) during any practice or competition.

RESOLUTION OF ISSUES

If you have or become aware of a problem:

- Remember, we all are human, we all make mistakes, and we all say and do things we should not do.
- Try to keep a thick skin - try to not be easily offended.
- Put yourself in the other person's shoes - try to understand where the other person is coming from.
- Give yourself a day or two to think the issue or situation over - knee-jerk reactions can blow up a simple misunderstanding into a major issue.
- Attempt to work out the issue/misunderstanding directly with the other person first.

HOWEVER, the above does not apply if you experience or witness serious problems, such as abusive behavior, alcohol use/abuse, etc.

If you are unable to resolve the issue/misunderstanding directly with the other person, or the issue is serious in nature, please follow the below steps:

- If the issue is with another team member (competitor), a parent, a parent/coach, or a staff member, please discuss the matter directly with the Director. It would be helpful if, prior to your discussion, you write down your thoughts, the details regarding the issue, steps you've already taken to resolve the issue (if any), and thoughts on how the problem might be resolved.
- If the issue is with the Director, or you do not feel comfortable addressing the problem with the Director, please discuss the matter with the HHA Representative listed in this Parent's Guide. Please prepare notes as outlined in the prior paragraph. Pam can assist in arranging the meeting with the HHA Representative.

Under NO CIRCUMSTANCES is it appropriate for any competitor, sibling, parent, parent/coach, Staff Member, or even the Director, (or their spouses, friends, or relatives) to air grievances through social media, texts, e-mails, or gossiping. Failure to work in a positive, constructive manner towards resolving problems may result in removal from the team. Attitudes, words, and actions that are destructive to the team will not be tolerated.

REGULAR SEASON MATCHES

Except for the National match, all competitions the past years have been held within 2 hours of Harrisburg Hunters' and Anglers' Association. When possible, shooters' families travel to the competitions as a team or several groups via carpool/caravan.

After some competitions, the team's families get together at a local restaurant for dinner. This outing varies due to the day and

time we compete. Our biggest outing is after the Spring Fling Match in Boyertown where we go to the Port Clinton Hotel (except when they host states).

The regular season competitions are scheduled over an entire weekend (Saturday/Sunday). We will not be competing both days. We will be given one time slot and will compete during that time, then leave. The potential

weekends are already listed on the website. Please mark your availability in TeamApp's availability section as soon as you can. We will request a time slot on the day with the most amount of yeses. We know that not every shooter is available for every competition and we will miss your family if you have a prior commitment. The State Match will be all day. Information on that match can be found on page 7.

LOCATIONS AND DATES

The competition locations are:

- Winter Championships - *Palmyra, PA*
 - 2nd or 3rd weekend of February
- Fun Shoot - *Home Club*
 - 1st Friday after Winter Championships
- NRA Sectional - *Penns Valley, PA*
 - 1st or 2nd weekend of March
- Spring Fling - *Boyertown, PA*
 - 3rd or 4th weekend of March
- PA State Championship Match - *Varies*
 - 1st or 2nd weekend of April (close to Easter)
- NRA Postal Match - *Home Club*
 - during a regular Training (practice) within 2 weeks of the State Match (see calendar)
- Sugar Shoot - *Home Club*
 - after Postal and State Matches (see calendar)
- National Championship Match - *Rogers, AR*
 - over July 4th weekend

The above schedule is subject to change. Along with the most up-to-date calendar information, directions to all matches can be found on the schedule and directions page on the website, under Education and Scores.

POSTAL MATCH

During the 2 weeks following the state match, we shoot the postal match. This match will appear as a practice. The shooters will shoot each of the four positions with the scores being sent to the NRA where they are ranked and placed on their website. If one of our teams place in the top three, the NRA will send plaques for each of those five shooters. Depending on the score your shooter receives, a marksmanship card may be received, as well.

The NRA Postal Match does not include a test.

TEAM MEMBERS

A team consists of 5 shooters and 2 alternates. At each competition, we take multiple teams consisting of 5 to 7 shooters. One of these teams will be the A team, consisting of shooters who wish to win a trophy at States, then attend Nationals. (*If your shooter is not able to attend Nationals, please let us know so the spot can be given to someone who is able to attend.*) The remaining teams will be B teams. We are able to enter an unlimited number of B teams, who compete for top team in the B division.

ALTERNATES

"What does it mean when you say my shooter is an alternate?"

If something happens to one of our shooters and they are unable to finish the match, an alternate and that shooter will switch places on the team. This means the alternate will now have a score that counts toward the team score.

An alternate position is **not** a bad position. At the state and national matches, the top alternate receives a medal for his/her achievement. This shooter may attend next year. Only team members must skip a year.

SCORE

Each shooter can earn up to 500 points. How are these points earned?

- prone position = up to 100 points
- standing = up to 100 points
- sitting = up to 100 points
- kneeling = up to 100 points
- education test = up to 100 points

Each team has the potential of earning 2500 points, as only the main 5 members scores count. All 7 members compete for medals in each position.

STATE MATCH

The Pennsylvania State Championship BB Gun Match occurs every April. Shooters from across the state compete for awards, certificates, trophies, and prestige. We compete as a team and as individuals.

There is a rotation of clubs who host the state match. When we are not the host, there may be years when we stay in a hotel the night prior to the competition. This is not mandatory and is at each families' expense. We try

to stay at the same hotel so the kids can be together, studying and preparing themselves for the match. Swimming is not permitted as it tires the eyes and affects their ability to focus, resulting in poor shooting at the match. Some families, depending on arrival time, have dinner together that evening. The shooters get a good night's sleep, then travel to the match together.

When we host States, we work together to achieve success.

Friday night: clean the club and set up the ranges and various tables.

Saturday: staff the breakfast table, bake sale table, raffle table, and concession stand.

During the months prior to the match, we acquire donations for the various tables. We ask businesses to donate trophies for our winners. The more donations we can acquire, the more profit we receive to use for our Nationals trips.

RULES OF THE DAY

- The team remains together at our designated tables for the day. No shooter should be outside at any time.
- Shooters' eyes must be on their own test during testing and never wander. Doing so will result in a score of **ZERO!**
- If a shooter is not on the firing line or in the ready chair, they are **NOT** in the range area.
- Shooters are not to be looking at theirs or anyone else's targets or scores at any time.

- Parents may **ONLY** request their shooter's scores during or after awards!
- Under no circumstances should **ANYONE** be sharing scores with shooters. **Only** a Director may talk with the shooter and share general information. **Parents** should **NEVER** be sharing any score information with the shooters.
- A designated person has entrance privileges during the match to receive scores and deliver the scores to the Directors. These scores are

ONLY for the directors and score book monitors and are **NOT** to be shared with shooters at all during the day!

- Our team sits together for dinner and awards. No families should leave the premises without permission from the directors. The reason for not being able to attend dinner and awards needs to be discussed with the directors prior to the day of the match. Leaving the premises before our team picture could result in the team member being ineligible for Nationals.

SAMPLE SCHEDULE

Unlike the "arrive, shoot, and leave on one of two days" match like the regular season, the State Match is an **all-day** match. Here's a *sample* of the day:

- Each member of the top 3 A teams
- Individual Champion (excluding test)
- Overall Champion (including test)
- Overall Alternate (including test)

Individual Medals for:

- Each member of the top 2 B teams
- 1st, 2nd, and 3rd place in each position

Education:

- Award: team with highest combined test score
- Certificate: each shooter with perfect test score

FUNDRAISING

The purpose of fundraising is to keep our program free and open to the public.

Harrisburg Hunters and Anglers Association helps us financially, when they can, but relying on them does not work, because they may have a bad year resulting in them being unable to assist with our expenses. Since you can only "nickle and dime" your family and friends for candles, subs, and pies so many times before they refuse to purchase any more, we have been moving to larger fundraisers. The publicity we get

from these larger fundraisers is more beneficial than multiple smaller fundraisers. This publicity brings attention to our team and draws new shooters. Since our program is the first stepping stone of all programs at Harrisburg Hunters and Anglers, that means we get additional support from our members with the larger fundraisers.

We have several fundraisers throughout the year and participation in each of them is strongly encouraged because many hands make light work. The more families we have

participating in fundraising, the more funds we can raise for our team. (See list of Team Expenses to understand our need of these monies.) The bulk of money fundraised is used for the Nationals trip, when we qualify.

The raffle makes us a lot of money with one fundraiser. As a team, we must sell all 500 tickets. Soliciting funds using the "Sponsors Wanted" form is an easy way to raise money. The levels are below and there is a form in the last section of this packet. Let Tina know if you have any questions about fundraising.

SCRIP GIFT CARDS

Know anyone who purchases anything? By anything, we mean groceries, clothing, construction supplies, restaurant meals, or literally, anything. Some cards in this program need pre-planning (plastic cards), but others only take a few minutes (ScripNow).

How does ScripNow work? First, you'll need to sign the Scrip Program Rules and Guidelines found in the forms section of this packet, create an account, connect to CHAMPs, the start purchasing.

How do I purchase a certain card? Log into your account, click in the search field (top, right in the window), then type the store/restaurant where you will be shopping/eating. Your denomination selections will appear.

Do I pay any fees? The short answer is yes. You'll want to use PrestoPay at checkout. Using PrestoPay, you are charged a 15 cent transaction fee. This works like PayPal and comes directly out of your checking account. Credit card payments are also a payment option. Unlike the flat rate for PrestoPay, using a credit card, you are charged a minimal percentage of the transaction amount as the fee.

We only submit a plastic order at the beginning of December so they arrive for Christmas gifts, but the ScripNow cards are available regularly! If we have enough interest, we could place an order during the season. Sometimes, we can get a donation to cover the shipping. If not, it could be up to \$15, depending on the time of year we are placing the order.

HOW WE RAISE FUNDS

- Sponsorships - ongoing
- Scrip Gift Cards - online is ongoing with ScripNow using PrestoPay; plastic sale is in December
- Lottery Raffle - ticket sales start in October and run through March 31st.
- Apple Dumplings - October (November delivery)

- Car Show - working on adding this
- Block Shoot - close to adding this in schedule

RAFFLE

We are selling raffle tickets! This is a cash raffle. Our raffle is **not** affiliated with any state Lottery.

The trip to attend the National BB Gun Championship Match in Rogers, Arkansas begins here, in Harrisburg, Pennsylvania. This trip is a bonding experience not only for the shooters attending the match, but also for the parents and families. Each year, there is a potential to visit sites while en route. Previous sites the shooters visited include the Flight 93 Memorial in Shanksville, Pennsylvania; the Gateway Arch in St. Louis, Missouri; the original Bass Pro in Springfield, Missouri; camping on Route 66; the Air Force Museum in Dayton, Ohio; tornado destruction in Joplin, Missouri; and the Welcome to Pennsylvania, West Virginia, Ohio, Indiana, Illinois, Missouri, and Arkansas signs.

PINTED GUN CONTEST

Awards are given for 1st, 2nd, and 3rd place for painted guns. The theme is different each year.

As a note: We allow the painting of personal guns as long as a minimum score is shot in a competition match. Practice scores do not count.

To learn more about painted guns, talk to Chet. He can show you pictures of past guns that have been painted. No two guns on our team are ever painted the same, so you know your gun will be unique.

PARTICIPATION

Invitations to compete in the Daisy National BB Gun Championship Matches are issued to the top three placing teams in each of the State Championship Matches.

Individuals who competed at Nationals as a regular team member last year are not eligible to compete as a regular team member or alternate at Nationals this year. They must sit out one year to be eligible to compete again. This rule assures that new shooters will get a chance to compete. Daisy offers a separate "Champions Match" for shooters who competed on a team last year. Those who competed as Alternates last year may compete as regular team members this year.

AWARDS

Gold, Silver, and Bronze Medals:

- Team Alternate in each position
- Team Alternate High Aggregate (including test)
- Team Member in each position
- Team Member High Aggregate (including test)
- High Team

TEAM COLORS CONTEST

Since Daisy likes to keep things fresh and new, their special contests vary each year. There is usually a theme. Here is a previous year's contest:

How does the team colors contest work?

Teams wear their team colors to the Opening Ceremony.

Should teams use props?

Banners, signs and thematic display materials are welcome. Creativity is encouraged.

When is judging for the contest done?

Judging will be done during the Parade of Champions, which is when teams enter the convention center room, are introduced, and pose on the podiums for team photos.

Who does the judging?

The Daisy Sales Team will be judging.

What are the categories for team prizes?

Best t-shirts and best theme.

NATIONALS FUNDRAISING

For our 2017 trip to Rogers, Arkansas, we took to GoFundMe and created a campaign to raise money to make the trip easier on the parents. After months of training and preparation, at the recent Pennsylvania State Championships, the Harrisburg Hunters and Anglers Youth BB Gun team qualified for a coveted spot in the 52nd Annual Daisy National BB Gun Championships to be held from June 30 to July 3, 2017 in Rogers, Arkansas. Earning this spot at Nationals is a dream come true for these 8 to 15 year olds, and proof that hard work and dedication will be rewarded.

Taking their spot at Nationals and matching their skills against the best youth in the country won't be cheap, so that's why they're asking for your help.

Between gas, hotel rooms, food and supplies, the cost for each team member to make the trip is about \$1000. With five team-members and two alternates prepared to journey to Rogers, that's \$7000 – the original fundraising goal of this campaign. Since we have had some success in various other fundraising efforts, we've been able to cut our original fundraising goal for this campaign in half!

Now you're probably asking, "Why should I support this team?" Well, because both this team and the Harrisburg Hunters and Anglers Youth Shooting program represent everything that's right about sports today. These kids don't just line up and fling BBs down-range -- they train to develop the focus, discipline, control and determination that will not only help them succeed as athletes, but as hard-working, productive and responsible members of the community.

In addition, the first five weeks of every season, and half of every 2 hour practice is spent in a classroom setting and devoted to learning about shooting safety and education. Not only does this prepare them for the mandatory safety and education written test that is a part of every competition, but it also ensures that that they will be safe, responsible and respectful throughout their lives. This safety and education curriculum is a real point of emphasis for this club and the shooters take it seriously. As a result, the team won the first place trophy for their scores on the 2017 Pennsylvania State Championship Safety and Education Test!

Finally, you can donate to this team with the knowledge that 100% of all funds received through this campaign will go toward sending this youth team to nationals, and any extra funds will benefit next year's season for both new and experienced shooters. The Harrisburg Hunters and Anglers Youth BB Gun Team is a 100% volunteer-run program operating under the umbrella of the Competitive Harrisburg Association of Marksmanship Programs (CHAMPS), a registered 501(c)(3) non-profit volunteer organization whose purpose is to promote youth conservation and marksmanship programs and teach safe methods in sporting activities.

COACHING INFORMATION

WHAT IS A COACH?

When referring to coaches in documentation, the writers are referring to Rusty, Chet, and Pam. When referring to coaches at practice, we are referring to line coaches. Rusty is the team's Director, Chet is the Assistant Director/Gunsmith, Pam is the Education Director/Statistical Officer, and Tina is the Fundraising Director/Assistant Statistical Officer.

Line coaching positions are filled by parents, grandparents, aunts/uncles, or other adults. This person makes sure the shooter is in the correct position (the same way) for each shooting position, loads the BBs into their gun, and adjusts the gun sights as needed.

GUIDELINES FOR SUPPORTIVE PARENTS AND COACHES

Youth programs are rarely successful without the support of parents and coaches. Below are a few guidelines for parents and coaches as they strive to support the young athletes.

You, as a supportive parent and coach should...

- focus on mastering sport skills and strategies rather than on competitive ranking
- decrease the pressure to win
- believe that the sport's primary value is the opportunity for self-development
- communicate any concerns directly with the coaching staff
- understand and respect the differences between parental roles and coaching roles
- control negative emotions; use positive reinforcement
- avoid the use of fear and punishment to get kids to perform better
- avoid criticism
- recognize and understand expressions of insecurity and provide support when necessary
- avoid the use of guilt to manipulate children to perform the way you want them to perform

RESPONSIBILITIES AND EXPECTATIONS

In order for a program to be truly successful, it takes the cooperation of everyone involved: players, coaches, officials, and especially parents. Parents have the following responsibilities and expectations when participating in our program:

Parents have a responsibility to their children:

To make sure that your child gets the most out of his or her experience, parents should show their unwavering support, including positive reinforcement of your child's performance and effort. This is absolutely essential to ensure their healthy development. Parents should also be positive role models, including, but not limited to, showing proper sportsmanship at all times and refraining from negativity of any kind.

Parents have a responsibility to the coaching staff:

The coaching staff volunteers their personal time to spend it with your child. They need you to be supportive of their decisions and not undermine their efforts. If you don't agree with a coach, you are expected to tell that coach, but make certain it is done at the right time and place and not in front of the children. It is highly encouraged for parents to stay and participate.

Parents have a responsibility to the other parents:

Personal gain and satisfaction should not be derived from your shooter's performance. Competition and taunting between parents is never acceptable, and no parent should ever feel embarrassed or disappointed by their shooter's performance. Every shooter is important to our team.

COACHING PHILOSOPHY

As the line coach, forget the professional and college coach models and the win at all cost approach. Do not try to get your feeling of self-worth from your shooter's scores. Coaching calls for teaching the fundamentals properly. The most important element is the relationship between the line coach and the shooter, whether he/she is your or someone else's child. You are a leader, role model, teacher, and friend. This relationship is far more significant than points scored.

LINE COACH INFORMATION

1. How To and Not To Coach

Stay Calm! No matter the shot, good or bad, your emotions on the line go into every shot. The kids work from your coaching. The calmer you are, the steadier they can be. Use a monotone voice at all times on the range, unless a safety matter needs immediate attention. If a shooter needs to be corrected, do so off the firing line, away from the other shooters.

2. Position (Prone, Standing, Sitting & Kneeling)

Shooters should get into position. Shooter should set up and check zero point of hold.

- Shooter should align themselves in a straight line to the bulls they are shooting. This is done by:
 - aim at center of bull
 - close eyes
 - take a breath
 - exhale
 - open eyes
 - check bull
- If still centered, the shooter is ready to shoot that line of bulls.

Coaches should check positions from all angles.

- From the side, check shooter's hold and hand position. Hands should be placed on the gun the same way each time. (See #5.)
- The trigger finger is important, too. It should be placed on the trigger, before the first knuckle, on the meaty part of the finger, so the squeeze will be straight back, slow and steady, not to jerk or pull the gun.
- Stand behind the shooter to check shooter's alignment to bulls. If in the correct position, the stock to the front of barrel to the bull being shot should be a straight line.
- Check for good steady position.

3. Shot Placement

Looking at where the shot hits on the target can tell you what the shooter is doing. For example: A shot to the right on a right hand shooter could be trigger pull or finger too far in the trigger. This is what we should concentrate on instead of getting loud or making comments about the shot; just go right into "the why mode". Why did that shot hit where it did? Take the time to check each shot. 10 minutes is a long time.

4. Take Notes

Write down hand placement, where gun sits on cheek, where front hand goes, and target heights; anything that will help with repetition of the shot. Use the daily log sheets as a diary to keep track of what you eat, drink and your activity the day of practices and/or matches. You will discover sugar and caffeine have a negative effect on your shooting, as well as certain activities during that day.

5. "Gun Decorations"

Use markings to assist in knowing the gun is placed the same way every shot. Examples:

- A piece of tape on the stock and a freckle on the shooter's face.
- A mark on the forearm and a particular finger on that mark.

RECRUITING EVENTS

NATIONAL NIGHT OUT

This event is held the 1st Tuesday of August each year, across the Nation. The township where the club is located is Lower Paxton Township. Their event is held in George Park (AKA Possibility Place), on Nyes Road, behind Paxtonia Elementary School. The club has a stand with information and several volunteers. If you would be interested in assisting with the kids' games, please let Pam know. Even our shooters can assist, if they would like!

GENERIC EVENTS

There are a variety of events available for us to attend to recruit new shooters. We limit our participation depending on the need for recruiting.

A few years ago, we attended an event at Field and Stream. Teams received a gift card for attending. Interaction is key at an event like this. The customers at the store voted for the table they enjoyed most. The winner of those votes received an additional gift card. These were used to purchase new binoculars.

If we participate in another event like this, we will be requesting parents and shooters to fill time slots.

INFLATABLE RANGE

Daisy offers an inflatable range. If we acquire use of the range and attend events, we will need several adults to assist with a variety of tasks such as liability forms, talking about our program, matching gun to shooter, assisting shooter with BBs, switching targets, etc.

YOUTH FIELD DAY

Saturday of Father's Day weekend is traditionally the day Capital Area Sportsmen For Youth (CASFY) holds their Youth Field Day. Our team runs the BB Gun station. In order for the station to be productive, many shooters, parents, and other adults are needed.

Since the indoor archery range is used on Saturday, we are at the club Friday evening for equipment retrieval and setup. Our station uses the 25 yard range. The positions we need filled include:

- corralling participants
- arranging participants in groups of 5
- handing out (and retrieving) safety glasses
- sizing guns to shooters
- loading BBs for participants (usually our shooters)
- assisting our shooters (usually parents)
- floater - switching with the above positions so some can have a "break" during the day


The layout is below. Here is a description of the layout:

The shooters come off the grey path, following the brown lines. The parents stop at the red oval and chat with Pam while the shooters continue to the blue rack for safety glasses and a gun, then move to the green firing line to shoot at a target on the black rectangle. (*Selected individuals will shoot from the purple firing line.*) All participants shoot in the standing position in groups of 5.
